- >\$22M in Additional funding for Administration of Programs


The Vision

National School Lunch Program


► **Lunch Service Options:**

- 1. Grab and Go Lunch Boxes**
- 2. Pre-wrapped Entrees**
- 3. Salad Bars**
- 4. Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Bars**
- 5. Theme Bars: Pasta Stations, Broth Bowls and Burrito Bars**

Community Eligibility Program (CEP)

- ▶ **CEP Eligibility**
- ▶ ☐ Have a minimum level (40%) Identified Students in the year prior to implementing the Provision (April 1).
- ▶ ☐ Agree to serve free lunches AND breakfasts to all students for up to four consecutive years in approved schools.
- ▶ ☐ Agree to cover with non-Federal funds any costs of providing free meals to all students above amounts provided in Federal assistance.
- ▶ ☐ Do not collect free and reduced price applications from households in participating schools during the period of participation in the CEP.
- ▶ ☐ Count total breakfasts and lunches served to students.
- ▶ ☐ Must NOT be a Residential Child Care Institution (RCCI).

CEP at Port Huron Schools

- ▶ Increased breakfast counts from 1,100 meals to 4,300 meals per day.
- ▶ Increased Lunch counts from 5,200 meals to 6,100 meals per day.
- ▶ Priority schools were removed from the list due to the breakfast participation in the morning—hungry kids can't learn.
- ▶ Shorter wait times in lines at lunch time.
- ▶ All students are treated the same—no overt identification.





SCHOOL DINNER PROGRAM

The Sterling Heights High School and Warren Mott High School Dinner program is for students participating in teacher supervised after school educational programs. All students will need to sign the attendance sheet, as well as provide their ID number when receiving their dinner.

Meal service is from 2:30pm to 6:00pm on all school days excluding half days.

Each meal **must** include an entrée two choices of fruit and/or vegetable and a choice of milk.

Mondays: Hamburgers or Cheeseburgers

Tuesdays: Whole Grain Breaded Chicken Nuggets and Whole Wheat Roll

Wednesdays: Bosco Sticks with Marinara Sauce

Thursdays: All Beef Hot Dogs and Chili

Fridays: Breaded Chicken Sandwich

Sub Sandwiches and Chef Salad will be available daily to select as an entrée .

A variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, canned fruits, 100% juices, and steamed vegetables will be offered.
